Annotation. The article provides an overview of Tashkent State University of Law, including the educational institution's history, the organization of its academic programs, and information about the university's existing faculties.

TSUL is the main higher education and scientific-methodological institution in Uzbekistan for training legal personnel.

The university, as an independent educational and research institution, actively applies new pedagogical technologies in the educational process, conducts fundamental and scientific research on current issues of legislation and its application, as well as legal regulation in society, and carries out a wide range of spiritual and educational activities aimed at raising awareness and legal culture.

Tashkent State University of Law trains specialists at the bachelor's, master's, doctoral, and independent researcher levels.

The history of TSUL begins on April 21, 1918, when the Law Department was established within the Faculty of Social Economics of the Turkestan People's University. This was the first step in the formation of a legal school in Central Asia and Uzbekistan.

The university includes 16 specialized and 3 general education departments, as well as a Center for Advanced Training of Legal Personnel. It also manages an academic lyceum that provides secondary specialized education in social sciences and humanities.

By the Decree of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated April 29, 2020, No. UP-5987 "On Additional Measures for the Fundamental Improvement of Legal Education and Science in the Republic of Uzbekistan," the organizational structure of the Tashkent State University of Law was revised, and new faculties and structural subdivisions were created.

Currently, 5 faculties operate at Tashkent State University of Law:

1. Public Law;
2. Criminal Justice;
3. Private Law;
4. International Law and Comparative Jurisprudence;
5. Master's Degree and Distance Learning.

The educational process is organized at the bachelor's degree level in the following areas:

1. Public Law
2. Public Administration
3. Criminal Justice
4. Private Law



5. International Law and Comparative Law

In addition, the university offers 11 master's degree programs.
